4. First-aid measures

Inhalation Remove victim to fresh air. Get medical attention if symptoms persist.

Skin contact Wash contaminated skin with soap and water. Get medical attention immediately, if irritation develops.

5. Fire-fighting measures

Suitable extinguishing media Extinguish with alcohol-resistant foam, carbon dioxide or dry powder.

6. Accidental release measures

Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures Extinguish all ignition sources. Avoid sparks, flames, heat and smoking. Ventilate. Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up Use a non-combustible material like vermiculite, sand or earth to soak up the product and place into a container for later disposal.
